Introduction

Te reo Māori has a special place in New Zealand. It is one of our official languages and is a unique feature of our country on the world stage.

This is a plan to help revitalise and raise the status of te reo Māori, and it becomes a living language used by all of us. It will also promote learning of te reo Māori and encourage its use by creating opportunities for the language to be seen and heard every day within Excel Digital.

By taking a conscious action to assist with the revitalisation of te reo Māori within New Zealand, we can contribute to a better, more inclusive nation.

Purpose

The purpose of this Māori Language Plan is to direct and guide the actions of Excel Digital, in relation to the celebration, integration, protection and revitalisation of the Māori language in our business.

Current use of te reo Māori within Excel Digital

Excel Digital currently has 42 employees, all located at our site in Grenada North, Wellington. A survey was conducted of all staff to ascertain the current level of understanding and use of te reo Māori within the company and the appetite for assisting with language revitalisation.

10% of Excel Digital's staff-members currently identify as having Māori heritage. This figure is significantly less than the 16.5% of all New Zealanders that identify as being Māori.

Although, in general, there is a low current understanding and use of te reo Māori within Excel Digital's workforce, the survey identified a strong overall feeling of support within the company for helping to revitalise the language. This is highlighted by 88% of staff-members indicating they would be supportive of attending a te reo Māori workshop.

As one member of staff put it, "it's about time we are doing something."

Purpose

By implementing a Māori Language Plan, Excel Digital will:



Contribute to the revitalisation of te reo Māori within Aotearoa



Contribute to the ongoing development of our workforce by providing them with opportunities for learning and using te reo Māori.



Strengthen our identity as a New Zealand company that is committed to our country



Enhance our company's relationship with customers, many of whom have commenced their own journey towards revitalizing te reo Māori

The language plan that follows presents planned initiatives to achieve these aims.

Scope

This plan is initially for six months. At the end of this period the plan will be evaluated and reviewed. This plan is a living document and is subject to change.

Reviewing and Reporting

The Māori Language Plan will be reviewed monthly to track measurable progress towards the plan's goals. The outcome of each review will be reported to Excel Digital staff. A formal review will be conducted at the completion of the initial six months of the plan. The outcome of this review will be made available on the Excel Digital website.



Goals and Objectives.



Goal 1

Te reo Māori is valued and is seen and heard within Excel Digital

Excel Digital has a wider understanding and appreciation of te reo Māori and the value that it can bring to the company through encouraging and nurturing the use of te reo Māori in all forms of communication.



Goal 2

Staff are given an opportunity to learn te reo Māori

Excel Digital commits to developing its people's understanding of te reo Māori and normalising its use.



Goal 3

Excel Digital is acknowledged externally as contributing to the revitalisation of te reo Māori

Excel Digital's te reo Māori revitalisation efforts are promoted externally. Excel Digital engages with local iwi.

Roadmap

Language plan developed and reviewed by the Senior Leadership Team (SLT). Plan submitted to Te Taura Whiri i te Reo Māori for their input. Final plan is approved by the SLT.

Evaluate and review outcomes against approved success criteria

Community-facing services, sponsorships and resources will increasingly have te reo Māori content and focus. Excel Digital will engage a te reo Māori and tikanga expert to provide training and advice on te reo Māori and tikanga. An internal group consisting of staff from throughout Excel Digital championing te reo Māori and tikanga is established. Excel Digital celebrates Te wiki o te reo Māori, with activities throughout the week. Excel Digital's commitment to promoting te reo Māori is reflected in its recruitment procedures.	Excel Digital is clearly a company that values te reo Māori – people will know this because te reo Māori will be visible through signage in our premises, our digital environment and through oral and written communication by our staff. Excel Digital has an ongoing relationship with a Māori language expert, who provides guidance and translation services. An internal group consisting of staff- members from across Excel Digital has been established and is leading the ongoing activities. The Senior Leadership Team at Excel Digital support their activities. A te reo Māori tagline that has equal weighting with the current tagline (together let's excel) is established and is widely used. Te wiki o te reo Māori is celebrated, with signage throughout the building and activities to help promote the use of te reo Māori. Excel Digital's commitment to te reo Māori is included in all job vacancy advertisements.
